

She wishes to bring awareness and preserve the traditions in the United States. Recently, the Hunter Dance Department has led her to train in ballet and contemporary styles.

EcontrandoMe, is her first choreographic work that dives into the idea of finding one's authentic self, breaking boundaries and the blending of many dance cultures. She aims to continue dancing and choreographing.






