After getting her BA in Dance and BA in Early Childhood Education, she plans to teach children and dance her way somewhere as she is figuring out what to do next. At Hunter, Riia has taken classes with Blakeley White-McGuire, Pedro Ruiz and Alberto Del Saz, and danced in dance films choreographed by Rena Butler and Sidra Bell.

Riia's choreography is a continuation of her exploration of tunnels and circles that she started in Fall 2020 by choreographing and creating a dance film, "To Tunnel Through," which is an Idaho Screendance Festival 2020/2021 Award winner. In Spring 2021 Riia choreographed "Elliptic Orbits" for the Hunter College Kaye Playhouse stage and then created an experimental dance film of it, and it was an Astoria Film Festival 2021 Official Selection. "looping escape" is the last segment of the trilogy, for now, and explores the multiple ways the props can be manipulated.
